### Fees Term 3

Invoices will be sent out via newsletter pockets in week 1. Some families do have fees outstanding from Term 2 and we'd really appreciate it if these could be attended to as well.

We do very minimal fundraising at AMK and we include the costs of all excursions, bus transport and visiting presenters in our fees. Entrance and bus costs are very expensive and without payment of kindy fees we will not be able to continue to plan excursions.



In term 3 both groups will be involved in weekly dance lessons with an instructor from 'Dancify' for 5 weeks beginning in week 1. At our last performance we hope to be able to invite parents to a dance show-case & morning tea. We will provide more details in the coming weeks.

In term 4 we have an excursion planned to the Adelaide Botanic Gardens and Little Sprouts Kitchen Garden and a performer for our final kindy day celebrations.

### RAA Street Smart Program

Last week both groups were involved in a workshop with a staff member from RAA's Street Smart Program. This is their new Road Safety program for preschools. It was great to have the staff trial this program with us. It focuses on road safety and fits within our own child protection curriculum. Each child was given a story book to take home by the program.



### Late pick-ups

All families are asked to ensure children are picked up **between 3:20pm and 3:30pm**. We have had families regularly arriving well after 3:30pm and this impacts the time we have to plan for the following day before our official finish time of 3:45pm. Our staff are very dedicated and are often here later but there are times that they have their own family commitments that they need to attend to and need to be able to leave on time.

### Covid-19 restrictions

Over the holidays I will be monitoring the Covid-19 situation closely. It may be that we need to place some additional restrictions in place to improve social distancing. This could include initiating drop offs and pick ups from the gate to reduce the number of people coming on site. We have regular updates from DfE and I will provide further information as needed.

**Parents** are asked to ensure they use the **Covid check-in** and **hand sanitiser** provided each time they come on site.

**Children** will be directed to wash their hands upon arrival as part of their morning/arrival routine. Put simply this is, unpack bag, place it in locker, take lunch box inside, wash hands then off to play.



## Keeping everyone healthy at preschool

This term we have had unprecedented levels of staff illness. We understand that when working closely with young children we are likely to pick up the odd cold or cough. However, we need families to help keep everyone well by keeping children who are sick at home. You are reminded that we will call families if children appear unwell and families will be expected to collect their children promptly.

There are a few non-negotiables about children's health that everyone should follow:

- **Children MUST be kept at home for 24 hours following any vomiting episodes.**
- **Children who have a temperature, cough, runny nose, sore stomach, sneezing or complain they feel unwell MUST stay home.**
- **Children SHOULD not attend preschool if they are given Panadol or Nurofen in the morning because they are feeling unwell. These medications can mask pain and fever.**

Families should also consider Covid-19 safety precautions and seek medical advice if their children are unwell.
